The minimum package for students entering the 2023-2024 academic year offers five contiguous years of support that includes a Student Academic Appointment (SAA) in the form of a teaching or research assistantship with a stipend of at least \$26,250 per year (\$22,854 for the 10-month academic year and \$3,396 for the summer). Student Academic Appointees (SAA) are expected to spend approximately 20 hours each week on their assigned duties or projects. The appointment also includes a fee remission which waives tuition (currently worth \$39,915.30 for a non-resident), student health insurance (currently worth \$3,458.59) and fees (mandatory and course fees). The annual stipend paid to teaching assistants is considered taxable income, and it is our understanding that the tuition remission is non-taxable. Please note that a summer assistantship requires students to be on campus during the summer.
